

2026 Feast Invitation Letter

September 26-October 4, 2026

Greetings Brethren and Friends!

This letter is written inviting you to participate with us in observing the Feast of Tabernacles again this year. As you well know, much has been happening within the Body of the Messiah and the world around us since the Feast of Tabernacles in 2025. Coming together to worship Yahweh and seek His direction has become increasingly urgent this year, even more than in years past. To that end, Yahweh has showered upon us an unexpected blessing this year. The Feast will be preceded immediately by the weekly Sabbath of September 26, making the start of the Feast of Tabernacles be two Sabbaths back to back, the weekly Sabbath of September 26 immediately followed by the First High Sabbath of the Feast on September 27. The convocation will also conclude with double Sabbaths, with the weekly Sabbath during Sukkot immediately being followed by the Last Great Day of October 4. I pray we take advantage of this additional time to commune with our Heavenly Hosts, Almighty Yahweh and our Savior Yahshua, drawing ever closer to them at this sacred time.

As we are told in Hebrews *“Forsake not the assembling of yourselves together, and so much more, as you see the day approaching.”* With the heightened seriousness of events taking place around us, it sometimes becomes a challenge to not be swept up in the cares of this life and allow ourselves to become untethered from the truly important elements of our life which sustain us. The Scriptures provide an anchor for us to remain moored to Truth, revealing the Way to eternal Life, a path which transcends the trials of this present wicked world.

The Feast of Tabernacles observance can reset our priorities in such a way as to enhance our opportunity to remain strong in these guiding principles. This year, as has been our practice for the past 19 years, Yahweh’s Free Brethren will be hosting the Feast of Tabernacles here in the eastern United States. It

has been our privilege to provide camping free of charge for those who make the trek for this observance.

This year we will be hosting the Feast at Camp Rocky Creek in Cornwall, Pennsylvania, a rustic and isolated setting which doubles as a summer youth camp for the YMCA. The facilities are primitive, which adds to the intent and ambience of the Feast of Sukkot. Cabins with electric and bunks that sleep up to 10 are available, and these are available on a first come, first served basis. While the cabins do not have water or restroom facilities, there are modern bathhouses in close proximity to them. Should you opt to stay in a cabin, you will need to bring your own bedding.

We also would invite you to manifest any talents you may have through volunteer service to the assembled brethren. This includes such things as food service, meeting hall, dining hall and bathroom cleanup, musical offerings, and policing the grounds to ensure that they stay clean and safe for all. We are also planning to have children's classes and dedicated youth recreational times. Your assistance on these fronts will be much appreciated to help the Feast be a time of enjoyment for the youth as well. The young in our midst are a treasure to be appreciated, so if you can help out in any of these areas it will be much appreciated. Signup sheets will be available in the meeting hall for you to sign in order that you might bless those at this observance in 2026.

The Reservation Form has been made available for you to fill out and return. We ask that you return the Form by September 20 so we have time to process them. We also ask that you download them if you are online, returning a hard paper copy to: YFB

During the Feast we also provide two meals a day for the attendees, and this is another offering our assembly makes for those who have come to spend this period of worship with us. We will not be able to accommodate special needs diets, however. One reason we ask you to fill out a reservation form is so that

we can make proper supply preparation in advance for the number of people who will be in attendance.

As for further accommodations, in addition to the cabins there is also plenty of room for tenting, as well as space for five RV's and campers. There are no hookups for the campers and RV's (of which we have room for 5), but electric will be available for a nominal fee. However, water and sewer hookups will not be on site. There are also hotels in the local area which can be accessed for those staying off site. Another recent accommodation option can also be accessed through Airbnb or Vrbo. These websites can also provide a fully furnished home in the area for a reasonable fee. There is an RV camp within close proximity to Camp Rocky Creek as well, should you wish to have full hookups for your RV.

The Dining and Meeting Halls are just across the courtyard from one another, with the Meeting Hall recently having been rebuilt. The Meeting Hall is also handicap accessible, with ramps in addition to steps. We shall be posting the Feast schedule in the coming weeks so you can reference what will be taking place during the observance. We are anticipating seeing you there, and this period of worship solitude and introspection is necessary annually to recharge our spiritual batteries.
